

# Medicaid Eligibility Statistical Analyses and Comparisons

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# Overview of National Tabulations

- During federal fiscal year 2011, an average of 56.2 million persons received Medicaid coverage at a given point in time
  - 69.5 million persons received at least one month of Medicaid coverage
  - 41.9 million persons were covered by Medicaid throughout 2011
- The continuously covered subgroup represented 60% of all persons who received any Medicaid coverage during the year
  - This subgroup represented nearly three-fourths (74%) of all Medicaid coverage months provided during 2011
  - Within major eligibility group and among persons with any 2011 coverage, 78% of dual eligibles and 78% of disabled non-duals were covered throughout the year. 61% of TANF children and 43% of TANF adults were covered all year.
- Covered months by major eligibility group were distributed 48% TANF children, 24% TANF adults, 9% disabled non-duals, 16% dual eligibles, and 3% other

## Medicaid Eligibility Was More Continuous/Stable in States Making Extensive Use of Capitated Care

- In 22 states, capitation represented more than 50% of Medicaid spending for TANF beneficiaries during FFY2011.
- In 7 states, capitation represented more than 50% of Medicaid spending for disabled non-dual beneficiaries during FFY2011.
- Eligibility statistics were aggregated in these heavily coordinated care states and compared with all other states. These comparisons are shown on the next slide.
- On every statistic assessed and for every eligibility category assessed, eligibility was more stable across the states making extensive use of coordinated care. This is likely attributable to MCO enrollment retention efforts (which include eligibility redetermination support).
